

Major Outcomes of the Strategic Plan for Year 2017-2022

1. *Multidisciplinary University*

- Marwadi University offers programs in Engineering, Management, Computer Applications, Science, Law, Pharmacy, Physiotherapy and Commerce. University has plans to start program in Nursing, humanities and other health related courses.
- University has constructed hi rise 10 story 'Satyarthi' building for Management and Law program having 80+ class rooms.
- New Hostel building D is under construction and Hostel Mess and Canteen was inaugurated last year for student use.

2. **Internationalization:** The international outreach initiative has fetched students from 35 countries for the admission year 2022-23. This includes students from SII scheme and also direct admissions. The admission data for AY 22-23 states that we are successful in getting 13 % of admissions, outside our country. This is expected to improve to 25% in the next 5 years.

Internationalization of Higher Education at Marwadi University:

Guided by the Mission and Vision statements, Marwadi University has endeavored to inculcate a spirit of scientific temper along with the values of spiritualism, truthfulness, and service to mankind. The vision of the university is to "foster an environment that empowers people, organizations, and societies through education, ideas, research, and training," covering the thrust of promoting education among all communities irrespective of religion, culture, and tradition.

- The University has established a dedicated International Relations Office since 2015 in compliance with UGC guidelines. The Office is sphere-headed by Director & Deputy Director, specializes in International Relations, and is equally supported by team members who engage themselves in initiating dialogue, establishing linkages with foreign institutes, and supporting international students in complying with Foreign and Regional regulations. University has appointed 4 international students as interns to help new students settle fast and make them understand the compliance processes of VISA, FRRO, etc.



- G20 and Guest Countries: This year, India holds the G20 presidency, and Marwadi University is thrilled to have 291 students from G20 and Guest Countries. The Government of Gujarat has recognized all these students as the G20 Student Ambassadors. They were invited to participate as Key Individuals in various G20 meetings to discuss Indian Culture, Economic Development, and Political Stability.
- Continuity in Globalization of Education: Marwadi University is one of the few in the Country to have more than 11% of its total student strength as international students hailing from 52 countries. The number of students enrolled in various programs has grown from 5 in 2017-18 to 1115 in 2022-23, and this trend is likely to continue.
- Global Partnership & Joint Research: Marwadi University has the vision to promote joint research, faculty, and student exchanges, create overseas job opportunities for international students and sensitize them to become global citizens.
- Marwadi University is a member of EdCIL (Educational Consultants India Limited), a Miniratna – category I Public Sector Undertaking in India under the administrative control of the Ministry of Education, Government of India. It actively takes part in its Flagship program called Study In India (SII). In 2019, the Institute was awarded the “High Performer Partner Institute Award” by EdCIL.
- Marwadi University has entered into MoU with European Universities under European Union programs such as ERASMUS+ that offer faculty and student exchanges. Further, the University also connects with like-minded overseas institutes and enters into partnerships for promoting joint research projects and teaching-learning aspects. The University has 32 active international MoU as of 6th Feb 2023.
- Faculty of Law, Marwadi University along with six other Universities submitted a proposal for the development of Post Graduate program in “International Law and Forced Migration Studies” which was selected for funding by ERASMUS+ KA2CBHE (ERASMUS+ Key Action 2 Capacity Building in the field of Higher Education). A cumulative grant of € 9.2 lacs is sanctioned for the project. Only 2 law schools from the entire country are part of this project.



- A grant of € 9.9 Lakhs is sanctioned by ERASMUS+ KA2CBHE (ERASMUS+ Key Action 2 Capacity Building in the field of Higher Education) for the development of Post Graduate program in “Climate Change Policy and Law” by the Faculty of Law at Marwadi University.
- Awarded Research Internships: MITACS Globalink Research Internship – Canada is a competitive program that pairs top-ranked international students with specific research expertise with faculty at Canadian academic institutions for a twelve-week research project. 7 students from the University were awarded a grant of 5.35 lacs in order to visit different universities in Canada.
- The University has entered into collaboration with the Scholarship Institute of Mozambique to provide access to quality Higher Education to Mozambican students through various scholarship schemes awarded to students from Individual institutions seeking admission to the partner University.
- Student Mobility: Marwadi University was granted funding under the ERASMUS+ Program (an initiative of the European Commission) which includes Bilateral Staff Exchange, Unilateral Student Exchange, and Collaborative Research Projects. The Mobility Programmes enhance the learning experience of students by exposing them to the cultural, economic, political, educational, and ecological aspects of other countries in order to develop global mindsets for better career advancement.
- Marwadi University has been shortlisted as one of the top 10 institutes for a grant of ₹. 10 Cr. for establishing a 100 bedded Study In India hostel at the campus under the Champion Services Sector Scheme (CSSS) of the Ministry of Commerce, Govt of India. University publishes Magazines having contributions from International Students and news about International Events at the University. Embassies and foreign collaborators appreciate MU Global Magazine.
- Culture Exchange: Foreign students at Marwadi University celebrate Navratri, Diwali, Holi, Lok Mela, and Gujarat's well-known kite festivals. When different nations celebrate their national days at Marwadi University, Indian students have the opportunity to learn about their cultures' economies and histories. At MU, students from Tanzania, Mozambique, Ethiopia, and Bangladesh commemorate their Independence Day as a national holiday. On this day, the University encourages embassy




officials and students to create special cultural activities about their nation, and arrange special food for their guests. As a result, Marwadi University has evolved into a Global village where all races, religions, and cultures are treated equally.

- Industry and Trade: Based on the collaboration with various Hungary Universities and the diversity on campus, the Embassy of Hungary decided to organize Hungary Day at Marwadi University and created a Market Place to showcase life in Hungary. The Ambassador of Hungary and officials of the University remained present for the discussion. Officials from Mozambique organized trade meetings with businessmen of the Rajkot region for the opportunity to do business with Mozambique.
 - Student Ambassador Program: Marwadi University has appointed student ambassadors from various countries who act as ambassadors of Marwadi University in their country. They give critical, on-ground information to aspiring students of their country and not only provide them with information about India, campus life and education at Marwadi University, but also receive them and make their initial days comfortable at the University.
 - Improvement of Content for Teaching and Learning: Marwadi university collaborated with reputed initiatives (e.g., IUCEE) to adopt best practices available in teaching and learning process. Faculties were also trained to learn novel concepts in teaching and learning process for implementation of these concepts to cater the need of internationalization.
3. **Apply to UGC for the U/S 2 (f) status:** University inspection by UGC peer team was completed and UGC has issued recognition for Marwadi University.
 4. **Develop industry supported laboratories:** University has established Marwadi University Jyoti CNC Automation - Association for Foundry Technology in collaboration with Jyoti CNC Ltd, IBM, Cisco Academy etc. to enhance level of skills for student for creating better employability.
 5. **Ranking:** University has applied for NIRF ranking and is not qualified to apply for major programs in NIRF. University leadership is learning from the process of NIRF application and working for its ranking improvement.
 6. **Improve Diversity:** As far as the student diversity is concerned, we have students from 21 out 36 states and UTs. Our outreach team has already planned for a better penetration so



that the remaining states can also be covered within a span of 5 years. The admission data 2022-23, reveal that we are successful in getting 12% of admissions, outside our native state of Gujarat. We plan to reach 25% of admissions, outside Gujarat within a period of 5 years.

7. **Enhance employability:** More than 400+ companies are coming to Marwadi University for campus providing huge placement opportunity for students.
8. **Innovation and Entrepreneurship:** Marwadi University has established dedicated innovation and entrepreneurship center, Marwadi University Centre for Innovation, Incubation and Research (MUIIR). Marwadi University has received support from Student Startup and Innovation Policy (SSIP) – Government of Gujarat and NewGen IEDC – Government of India to establish overall ecosystem related to startup and innovation. University has created dedicated coworking space as well as First offices to cater need to innovators and startups. University has also incepted Centre for Family Business (CFB) to cater need of students representing family business background. University also has dedicated manpower to run both these centers with full capacity.

The Provost, Dr. Y P Kosta, welcomed the Chairperson Mr. Ketan Marwadi and all the distinguished members of Governing Body.

Item No. 6 – Appointment – Head, International Relations, Marwadi University.

As a part of strategic plans adopted by the University and also to strengthen International relations among overseas university and to promote research activities and student/faculty exchange program, it was proposed to have a resource to oversee & execute the activities. The University shall also encourage for students and faculty exchange programs within the collaborated overseas universities. It was also proposed to send students to Poland and Germany as well as 2 faculty members shall be identified and encouraged to visit. The expenses towards students and faculty exchange programs shall be put up and accorded for approval from the members present in the Board.

Resolution:

RESOLVED that, the proposal for appointment of Head, International Relations shall be undertaken on an immediate basis. Students and faculty members shall be motivated and encouraged for exchange programs. The expenses incurred shall be approved by the Management Team of University.

31st Jan and 1st Feb 2022



Dinner Reception with Sir Steven Smith – UK


14th Mar 2022




Visit of Mauritius PM to Rajkot



NAFSA Conference Visit


30th May to 03rd Jun 2022







BOOK RECOMMENDATION CORNER

13 Secrets School Did Not Teach You About How To Be Rich



Siegel, a retired business executive, divides the book into 99 principles and eight money lessons that you should have learned by high school or college but didn't. This book was initially intended for his five children when he realized they didn't learn important personal finance principles before entering the real world, but it grew into a well-reviewed read full of money lessons, as well as firsthand experience and advice from Siegel. This easy-to-read book is ideal for new grads or anyone looking to start off their personal finance journey on the right foot.

By Rick Warren




The Purpose Driven Life is designed as a forty day spiritual journey – one chapter a day – with the goal of answering the question “What on earth am I here for?” (p15). The question is broad enough to address both believer and unbeliever alike, which may in part explain the width of its appeal. Warren's first section serves as a primer to the question. His goal is to prepare the reader to answer the two questions God will pose to him on the last day: What did you do with Jesus, and what did you do with what God gave you (p34)? Since life is about bringing glory to God (p53), the question to be answered is “How can I bring glory to God?” (p55). The answer is by worshiping Him, loving other believers, becoming like Christ, serving others with our gifts, and telling others about Him (pp55-57). The remaining five sections flesh out these ideas respectively. The most useful summary is given by Warren himself on p306, working from the Great Commandment (Matt 22:37-40) and the Great Commission (Matt 28:18-20)

By National Leader General Aung San 1915-1947

Aung San was a Burmese politician, independence activist and revolutionary. Aung San is the founder of the Myanmar Armed Forces, and is considered the Father of the Nation of modern-day Myanmar. He was instrumental in Burma's independence from British rule, but was assassinated just six months before his goal was realized.

Devoted to ending British rule in Burma, Aung San founded or was closely associated with many Burmese political groups and movements and explored various schools of political thought throughout his life. He was a life-long anti-imperialist and studied communism and socialism as a student, and Japanese Pan-Asianism upon joining the Japanese military. In his first year of university he was elected to the executive committee of the Rangoon University Students' Union and served as the editor of its newspaper. He joined the Thakin Society in 1938, working as its general secretary, and founded both the Communist Party of Burma and the Burma Socialist Party.



The Russian Invasion of Ukraine vis-a-vis International Law

Russia invaded Ukraine early on February 24, 2022, attacking many fronts with missiles, planes, and ground forces. The possibility of Ukraine and Georgia joining NATO had angered the Russian President, who wished to stop the alliance's eastward expansion and its encirclement of Russia. Since then, the international community has reacted to Ukraine's plea for assistance with military and humanitarian supplies as well as harsh sanctions on Russia but has refrained from deploying soldiers to the nation. The nation has also asked for assistance in front of international bodies including the International Criminal Court and the International Court of Justice. Russia's invasion of Ukraine is a violation of the prohibition on the use of force under Article 2(4) of the United Nations Charter. However, there are two exceptions to this prohibition; the use of force in self-defense under Article 51 of the Charter and collective security operations mandated by the Security Council. The use of force that does not fall within these exceptions is an act of aggression. However, as per Russia's recent submissions to the International Court of Justice, it has decided to defend its use of force as a form of collective self-defense under Article 51 of the UN Charter.

Tackling COVID-19 with AI

AI is a buzz word now for everything we do in our day-to-day life. In recent times mankind has seen the worst situation where everything which meant to be powerful had no control over lives. Nothing other than prevention and extension of natural immune system was shield for protection from Covid-19 virus. Masking face and nose was new normal for protection against this deadly virus. AI played a role as boon for working employees, it channelized way to protect people from traditional finger print punching to face or bio metric detection. Also, the idea that we come up with a system which could alert a person as soon as he removed mask, thus helping others and the individual to stay in-line with mask and hence protecting others from the deadly disease.

In past COVID-19 scenario when the deadly disease was huge spread, an effective face mask detection application using AI proved to be a saviour. This application helped in people to stay safe from spread of virus in the timeline when the number of instances of COVID-19 was being reported heavily around the country and was steadily rising due to opening of work spaces. The major purpose of this research was to put this AI based system in place at college entrances, airlines, hospitals, and offices where the risk of COVID-19 spreading through contagion is highest. According to reports, having a face mask while at work significantly minimizes the chance of transmission. For recognizing face masks, a hybrid model combining deep and traditional machine learning are used. This face mask detector is built with Python, OpenCV, TensorFlow, and Keras and is based on a dataset. Everyone should inspect their face before entering the building or the working area and make sure they have a mask with them which is wore and thus covers mouth and nose. A beep alert was triggered if somebody was found without a face mask. Thus, necessitating the



purpose of masking face. It can be brought to a close if everyone observes the safety precautions. As a result, we expect that this research will assist in detecting people wearing masks to work and thus help people to be safe during the spread of contagious diseases.

We as a group of researchers successfully made a system for face mask detection and checked its accuracy in all the environments one could work, so that the mandating of wearing mask is taken care of by machine itself without human intervention. This helps us to reduce manpower cost and casualties related to it, as the person has to be keen enough to check the surroundings and the employees involved. This proved to be an effective system to flatten the curve when the workspace is open and disease spread is on surge.

I welcome you once again to our University with great enthusiasm. I hope you enjoyed the insights of our 1st Volume of MU Global and appreciate your inputs for the same.







A FAIRYLAND IN LESOTHO? KOME CAVES SERVES

There is something special about visiting these modern-day cave dwellings in the heart of Lesotho. Who would believe that an 18th century hideout became a permanent and ongoing residence for two Lesotho tribes? The tall, deep rock overhanging characterizes the highlands of Lesotho. These have provided shelter to humans since time immemorial!

Kome caves are a group of cave dwellings made out of mud in the district of Berea, Lesotho 25 km east of Teyateyaneng. The site has been classified as a National Heritage Site. The cave dwelling tradition of Lesotho reaches its modern apotheosis at Ha Kome. Here, a cluster of 5 beautifully constructed igloo-like huts is set entirely within a deep natural overhang. Their smooth and curvaceous adobe exteriors reminiscent more of the adobe architecture of Mali's Bandiagara Escarpment than of anything else you'll see in Southern Africa. The trees that shelter the entrance to this far side of the cave were reputedly planted as protection from lightning when ancestors of the present day inhabitants dwelled almost 200 years ago. Still inhabited by a few fourth-generation descendants of its founders, the cave village at Ha Kome reputedly dates back to 1824, when it is served as a hideout for Basia and Bataung clans.

We thank the police for their respect for us and their concern for the safety and comfort of everyone. They also hosted us for lunch and drove us to our destination by their car. All thanks to the Police Officers and personnel of Rajkot City Police Department for their prompt response and the friendly Indian people and we wish always and forever peace in India and all over the world.

Apart from participation in the fairs, Dr Arjav visited Kibiti high school at Kibiti and addressed around 700+ students.




- Automatic driving and Grass removal from the highway lanes




Participation in 17th FICCI - International Conference - Developing World Class Faculty


1st International Conference on **Advancements In Smart Computing And Information Security - ASCIS 2022**




Paper Presentation of Dr Ramesh Bhoraniya in 23rd Australasian Fluid Mechanics Conference, Australia







THE LAST JUROR, BY JOHN GRISHAM


It begins as an ordinary story with a struggling journalist trying his best to make his mark. He gets interested in the case of a serial killer (kind of). Society considers him a lunatic for eliminating people involved in the jury of a sensational murder case of a mother and her kids. The story suddenly takes a twist when the true reason behind the killings is revealed. You gotta read it to actually feel the chills.

He will not have spectacular endings or plots that keep thickening. His stories will keep developing with an honest touch of realism and realistic characterization as you read along. The Last Juror is no different. It is a story about a small peaceful town where a heinous crime is committed and that is an extremely rare occurrence.

'The Last Juror' is set in the Deep South and has the rhythm of a story told on the front porch. Like many such stories it is about much more than what it is supposed to be about, so those who are compelled to find linear narratives in the novels they read are going to be frustrated, but hopefully not disappointed by Grisham's tale. You may not come to a final conclusion about what this novel is really about until you have read the final page, but there is really nothing wrong with that, even if it swims against the tide of contemporary best selling fiction. This is not a great novel or even a great Grisham novel, but it is a solid yarn, his best in years, and at this point in his career that may well be as good as it gets.

THE DIARY OF A YOUNG GIRL, ANNE FRANK

Anne Frank was a Jewish girl and when she was just 13, World War 2 broke out. Germans were looking for anyone they did not like everywhere. Anne Frank and her family fled to the secret annex in Amsterdam (the capital city of Holland) where they lived for 2 years in total seclusion. In 1942, with Nazis occupying Holland, a thirteen-year-old Jewish girl and her family fled their home in Amsterdam and went into hiding. For the next two years, until their whereabouts were betrayed to the Gestapo, they and another family lived cloistered in the "Secret Annex" of an old office building. Cut off from the outside world, they faced hunger, boredom, the constant cruelties of living in confined quarters, and the ever-present threat of discovery and death. In her diary Anne Frank recorded vivid impressions of her experiences during this period. By turns thoughtful, moving, and amusing, her account offers a fascinating commentary on human courage and frailty and a compelling self-portrait of a sensitive and spirited young woman whose promise was tragically cut short.

Anne writes in the voice of a young girl but also writes in an astonishingly real and mature way. Reading her diary entries will educate all readers on what it was truly like to live through the Holocaust, and will help those who want to be informed to be more educated on the event. The Diary of a Young Girl carries out the message of hope and teaches readers the horrors of history.

A MAN FOR ALL SEASONS, BY ROBERTS BOLT

Sir Thomas More, a scholar and statesman, objects to King Henry VIII's plan to divorce and remarry in order to father a male heir. But More, ever the diplomat, keeps quiet about his feelings in the hopes that Henry will not bother him about the matter. At a meeting with Cardinal Wolsey, Lord Chancellor of England, More reviews the letter to Rome that requests the pope's approval of Henry's divorce. More points out that the pope provided a dispensation, or exemption, in order for Henry to get married in the first place, since Catherine, the woman Henry married, was the widow of Henry's brother. More doubts that the pope will agree to overturn his first dispensation. Wolsey accuses More of being too moralistic and recommends that he be more practical.

After conversing with Wolsey, More runs into Thomas Cromwell, the king's confidante. Cromwell, recently promoted to the position of cardinal's secretary, insincerely tells More he is one of More's greatest admirers. More also meets Signor Chapuys, the Spanish ambassador to England.

Chapuys takes More's noncommittal response to questions about his meeting with Wolsey to mean that More agrees that the divorce should not go through. Chapuys stresses Christian morals and Catholic dogma and seems most concerned that Henry does not insult Henry's wife, Catherine, who is also the king of Spain's aunt. Chapuys thinks he has found an ally in More.

Back at More's home, More's daughter, Margaret, has received a visit from Roper, her Lutheran boyfriend, despite the late hour. Roper asks More for Margaret's hand, but More refuses to allow a Lutheran, in his eyes a heretic, into his family.

Meanwhile, Wolsey dies, leaving the position of Lord Chancellor vacant. The king was displeased with Wolsey's failure to secure a papal dispensation to annul his marriage to Catherine, and Wolsey died in disgrace. More is appointed as Wolsey's replacement.



Hey, do you like reading books? If your answer is yes then the book THINK BIG by Ben Carson will be an exciting choice for you to pick up and read.

Seems tough, nah, it's cool, try it! It will be like your personal movie theatre going on in your head.



Firstly, you should note that as much as this book will aid you in better managing your relationships, however, is not gospel truth.






THE FIRST SPACECRAFT TO TRAVEL BEYOND THE SOLAR SYSTEM

Voyager 1 is the first spacecraft to travel beyond the solar system and reach interstellar space. The probe launched on Sept 5, 1977 - about two weeks after its twin Voyager 2 - and as of August 2022 is approximately 14.6 billion miles (23.5 billion kilometers) away from our planet, making it Earth's farthest spacecraft. Voyager 1 is currently zipping through space at around 38,000 mph (17 kilometers per second), according to NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory.

When Voyager 1 launched a mission to explore the outer planets in our solar system, nobody knew how important the probe would still be. 45 years later the probe has remained operational long past expectations and continues to send information about its journeys back to the Earth.




SECURITY, TWO-FACTOR AUTHENTICATION (2FA) & PASSWORD GENERATOR

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



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PROVOST SAYS

Dinner Reception with Sir Steven Smith – UK




Visit of Mauritius PM to Rajkot



NAFSA Conference Visit


30th May to 03rd Jun 2022

UK Vice Chancellor Delegations Visit



09th and 10th June, 2022




BOOK RECOMMENDATION CORNER

13 Secrets School Did Not Teach You About How To Be Rich



Siegel, a retired business executive, divides the book into 99 principles and eight money lessons that you should have learned by high school or college but didn't. This book was initially intended for his five children when he realized they didn't learn important personal finance principles before entering the real world, but it grew into a well-reviewed read full of money lessons, as well as firsthand experience and advice from Siegel. This easy-to-read book is ideal for new grads or anyone looking to start off their personal finance journey on the right foot.

By Rick Warren




The Purpose Driven Life is designed as a forty day spiritual journey – one chapter a day – with the goal of answering the question “What on earth am I here for?” (p15). The question is broad enough to address both believer and unbeliever alike, which may in part explain the width of its appeal. Warren's first section serves as a primer to the question. His goal is to prepare the reader to answer the two questions God will pose to him on the last day: What did you do with Jesus, and what did you do with what God gave you (p34)? Since life is about bringing glory to God (p53), the question to be answered is “How can I bring glory to God?” (p55). The answer is by worshiping Him, loving other believers, becoming like Christ, serving others with our gifts, and telling others about Him (pp55-57). The remaining five sections flesh out these ideas respectively. The most useful summary is given by Warren himself on p306, working from the Great Commandment (Matt 22:37-40) and the Great Commission (Matt 28:18-20)

By National Leader General Aung San 1915-1947

Aung San was a Burmese politician, independence activist and revolutionary. Aung San is the founder of the Myanmar Armed Forces, and is considered the Father of the Nation of modern-day Myanmar. He was instrumental in Burma's independence from British rule, but was assassinated just six months before his goal was realized.

Devoted to ending British rule in Burma, Aung San founded or was closely associated with many Burmese political groups and movements and explored various schools of political thought throughout his life. He was a life-long anti-imperialist and studied communism and socialism as a student, and Japanese Pan-Asianism upon joining the Japanese military. In his first year of university he was elected to the executive committee of the Rangoon University Students' Union and served as the editor of its newspaper. He joined the Thakin Society in 1938, working as its general secretary, and founded both the Communist Party of Burma and the Burma Socialist Party.



The Russian Invasion of Ukraine vis-a-vis International Law

Russia invaded Ukraine early on February 24, 2022, attacking many fronts with missiles, planes, and ground forces. The possibility of Ukraine and Georgia joining NATO had angered the Russian President, who wished to stop the alliance's eastward expansion and its encirclement of Russia. Since then, the international community has reacted to Ukraine's plea for assistance with military and humanitarian supplies as well as harsh sanctions on Russia but has refrained from deploying soldiers to the nation. The nation has also asked for assistance in front of international bodies including the International Criminal Court and the International Court of Justice. Russia's invasion of Ukraine is a violation of the prohibition on the use of force under Article 2(4) of the United Nations Charter. However, there are two exceptions to this prohibition; the use of force in self-defense under Article 51 of the Charter and collective security operations mandated by the Security Council. The use of force that does not fall within these exceptions is an act of aggression. However, as per Russia's recent submissions to the International Court of Justice, it has decided to defend its use of force as a form of collective self-defense under Article 51 of the UN Charter.

Tackling COVID-19 with AI

AI is a buzz word now for everything we do in our day-to-day life. In recent times mankind has seen the worst situation where everything which meant to be powerful had no control over lives. Nothing other than prevention and extension of natural immune system was shield for protection from Covid-19 virus. Masking face and nose was new normal for protection against this deadly virus. AI played a role as boon for working employees, it channelized way to protect people from traditional finger print punching to face or bio metric detection. Also, the idea that we come up with a system which could alert a person as soon as he removed mask, thus helping others and the individual to stay in-line with mask and hence protecting others from the deadly disease.

In past COVID-19 scenario when the deadly disease was huge spread, an effective face mask detection application using AI proved to be a saviour. This application helped in people to stay safe from spread of virus in the timeline when the number of instances of COVID-19 was being reported heavily around the country and was steadily rising due to opening of work spaces. The major purpose of this research was to put this AI based system in place at college entrances, airlines, hospitals, and offices where the risk of COVID-19 spreading through contagion is highest. According to reports, having a face mask while at work significantly minimizes the chance of transmission. For recognizing face masks, a hybrid model combining deep and traditional machine learning are used. This face mask detector is built with Python, OpenCV, TensorFlow, and Keras and is based on a dataset. Everyone should inspect their face before entering the building or the working area and make sure they have a mask with them which is wore and thus covers mouth and nose. A beep alert was triggered if somebody was found without a face mask. Thus, necessitating the



purpose of masking face. It can be brought to a close if everyone observes the safety precautions. As a result, we expect that this research will assist in detecting people wearing masks to work and thus help people to be safe during the spread of contagious diseases.

We as a group of researchers successfully made a system for face mask detection and checked its accuracy in all the environments one could work, so that the mandating of wearing mask is taken care of by machine itself without human intervention. This helps us to reduce manpower cost and casualties related to it, as the person has to be keen enough to check the surroundings and the employees involved. This proved to be an effective system to flatten the curve when the workspace is open and disease spread is on surge.

I welcome you once again to our University with great enthusiasm. I hope you enjoyed the insights of our 1st Volume of MU Global and appreciate your inputs for the same.







A FAIRYLAND IN LESOTHO? KOME CAVES SERVES

There is something special about visiting these modern-day cave dwellings in the heart of Lesotho. Who would believe that an 18th century hideout became a permanent and ongoing residence for two Lesotho tribes? The tall, deep rock overhanging characterizes the highlands of Lesotho. These have provided shelter to humans since time immemorial!

Kome caves are a group of cave dwellings made out of mud in the district of Berea, Lesotho 25 km east of Teyateyaneng. The site has been classified as a National Heritage Site. The cave dwelling tradition of Lesotho reaches its modern apotheosis at Ha Kome. Here, a cluster of 5 beautifully constructed igloo-like huts is set entirely within a deep natural overhang. Their smooth and curvaceous adobe exteriors reminiscent more of the adobe architecture of Mali's Bandiagara Escarpment than of anything else you'll see in Southern Africa. The trees that shelter the entrance to this far side of the cave were reputedly planted as protection from lightning when ancestors of the present day inhabitants dwelled almost 200 years ago. Still inhabited by a few fourth-generation descendants of its founders, the cave village at Ha Kome reputedly dates back to 1824, when it is served as a hideout for Basia and Bataung clans.

We thank the police for their respect for us and their concern for the safety and comfort of everyone. They also hosted us for lunch and drove us to our destination by their car. All thanks to the Police Officers and personnel of Rajkot City Police Department for their prompt response and the friendly Indian people and we wish always and forever peace in India and all over the world.

Apart from participation in the fairs, Dr Arjav visited Kibiti high school at Kibiti and addressed around 700+ students.








Participation in 17th FICCI - International Conference - Developing World Class Faculty


1st International Conference on **Advancements In Smart Computing And Information Security - ASCIS 2022**

Visit of Dubai Fair and University


1st December To 7th December, 2022




Paper Presentation of Dr Ramesh Bhoraniya in 23rd Australasian Fluid Mechanics Conference, Australia







BOOK RECOMMENDATION CORNER

THE LAST JUROR, BY JOHN GRISHAM

Edoris Doe, Liberia




It begins as an ordinary story with a struggling journalist trying his best to make his mark. He gets interested in the case of a serial killer (kind of). Society considers him a lunatic for eliminating people involved in the jury of a sensational murder case of a mother and her kids. The story suddenly takes a twist when the true reason behind the killings is revealed. You gotta read it to actually feel the chills.

He will not have spectacular endings or plots that keep thickening. His stories will keep developing with an honest touch of realism and realistic characterization as you read along. The Last Juror is no different. It is a story about a small peaceful town where a heinous crime is committed and that is an extremely rare occurrence.

'The Last Juror' is set in the Deep South and has the rhythm of a story told on the front porch. Like many such stories it is about much more than what it is supposed to be about, so those who are compelled to find linear narratives in the novels they read are going to be frustrated, but hopefully not disappointed by Grisham's tale. You may not come to a final conclusion about what this novel is really about until you have read the final page, but there is really nothing wrong with that, even if it swims against the tide of contemporary best selling fiction. This is not a great novel or even a great Grisham novel, but it is a solid yarn, his best in years, and at this point in his career that may well be as good as it gets.

THE DIARY OF A YOUNG GIRL, ANNE FRANK

Dewmini Fonseka, Sri Lanka



Anne Frank was a Jewish girl and when she was just 13, World War 2 broke out. Germans were looking for anyone they did not like everywhere. Anne Frank and her family fled to the secret annex in Amsterdam (the capital city of Holland) where they lived for 2 years in total seclusion. In 1942, with Nazis occupying Holland, a thirteen-year-old Jewish girl and her family fled their home in Amsterdam and went into hiding. For the next two years, until their whereabouts were betrayed to the Gestapo, they and another family lived cloistered in the "Secret Annex" of an old office building. Cut off from the outside world, they faced hunger, boredom, the constant cruelties of living in confined quarters, and the ever-present threat of discovery and death. In her diary Anne Frank recorded vivid impressions of her experiences during this period. By turns thoughtful, moving, and amusing, her account offers a fascinating commentary on human courage and frailty and a compelling self-portrait of a sensitive and spirited young woman whose promise was tragically cut short.

Anne writes in the voice of a young girl but also writes in an astonishingly real and mature way. Reading her diary entries will educate all readers on what it was truly like to live through the Holocaust, and will help those who want to be informed to be more educated on the event. The Diary of a Young Girl carries out the message of hope and teaches readers the horrors of history.

A MAN FOR ALL SEASONS, BY ROBERTS BOLT

Su Myat Yati, Myanmar

Sir Thomas More, a scholar and statesman, objects to King Henry VIII's plan to divorce and remarry in order to father a male heir. But More, ever the diplomat, keeps quiet about his feelings in the hopes that Henry will not bother him about the matter. At a meeting with Cardinal Wolsey, Lord Chancellor of England, More reviews the letter to Rome that requests the pope's approval of Henry's divorce. More points out that the pope provided a dispensation, or exemption, in order for Henry to get married in the first place, since Catherine, the woman Henry married, was the widow of Henry's brother. More doubts that the pope will agree to overturn his first dispensation. Wolsey accuses More of being too moralistic and recommends that he be more practical.

After conversing with Wolsey, More runs into Thomas Cromwell, the king's confidante. Cromwell, recently promoted to the position of cardinal's secretary, insincerely tells More he is one of More's greatest admirers. More also meets Signor Chapuys, the Spanish ambassador to England.

Chapuys takes More's noncommittal response to questions about his meeting with Wolsey to mean that More agrees that the divorce should not go through. Chapuys stresses Christian morals and Catholic dogma and seems most concerned that Henry does not insult Henry's wife, Catherine, who is also the king of Spain's aunt. Chapuys thinks he has found an ally in More.

Back at More's home, More's daughter, Margaret, has received a visit from Roper, her Lutheran boyfriend, despite the late hour. Roper asks More for Margaret's hand, but More refuses to allow a Lutheran, in his eyes a heretic, into his family.

Meanwhile, Wolsey dies, leaving the position of Lord Chancellor vacant. The king was displeased with Wolsey's failure to secure a papal dispensation to annul his marriage to Catherine, and Wolsey died in disgrace. More is appointed as Wolsey's replacement.



Hey, do you like reading books? If your answer is yes then the book THINK BIG by Ben Carson will be an exciting choice for you to pick up and read.

Seems tough, nah, it's cool, try it! It will be like your personal movie theatre going on in your head.



Firstly, you should note that as much as this book will aid you in better managing your relationships, however, is not gospel truth.



■ Titanic Survivor or an Unlucky Charm?


William Clark is one of the survivors of the titanic but also one of the unluckiest men in history.




THE FIRST SPACECRAFT TO TRAVEL BEYOND THE SOLAR SYSTEM

Voyager 1 is the first spacecraft to travel beyond the solar system and reach interstellar space. The probe launched on Sept 5, 1977 - about two weeks after its twin Voyager 2 - and as of August 2022 is approximately 14.6 billion miles (23.5 billion kilometers) away from our planet, making it Earth's farthest spacecraft. Voyager 1 is currently zipping through space at around 38,000 mph (17 kilometers per second), according to NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory.

When Voyager 1 launched a mission to explore the outer planets in our solar system, nobody knew how important the probe would still be. 45 years later the probe has remained operational long past expectations and continues to send information about its journeys back to the Earth.

SECURITY, TWO-FACTOR AUTHENTICATION (2FA) & PASSWORD GENERATOR
