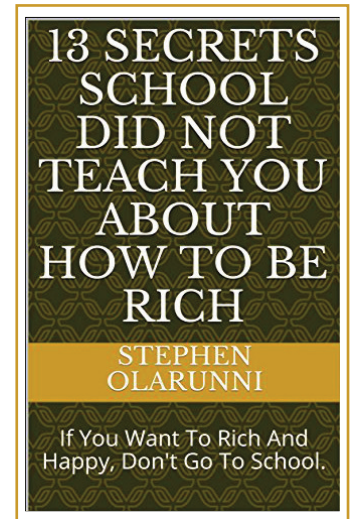

13 Secrets School Did Not Teach You About How To Be Rich

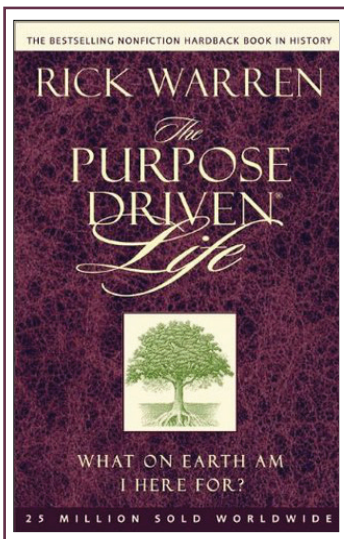

Siegel, a retired business executive, divides the book into 99 principles and eight money lessons that you should have learned by high school or college but didn't. This book was initially intended for his five children when he realized they didn't learn important personal finance principles before entering the real world, but it grew into a well-reviewed read full of money lessons, as well as firsthand experience and advice from Siegel. This easy-to-read book is ideal for new grads or anyone looking to start off their personal finance journey on the right foot.

By Rick Warren



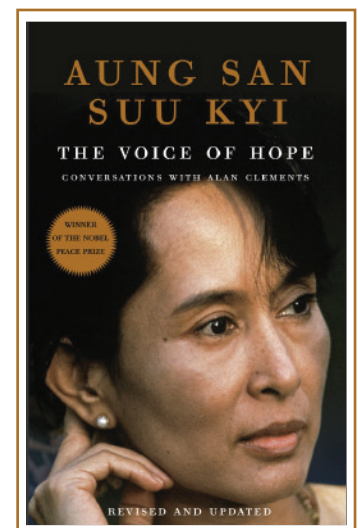
The Purpose Driven Life is designed as a forty day spiritual journey – one chapter a day – with the goal of answering the question “What on earth am I here for?” (p15). The question is broad enough to address both believer and unbeliever alike, which may in part explain the width of its appeal. Warren’s first section serves as a primer to the question. His goal is to prepare the reader to answer the two questions God will pose to him on the last day: What did you do with Jesus, and what did you do with what God gave you (p34)? Since life is about bringing glory to God (p53), the question to be answered is “How can I bring glory to God?” (p55). The answer is by worshiping Him, loving other believers, becoming like Christ, serving others with our gifts, and telling others about Him (pp55-57). The remaining five sections flesh out these ideas respectively. The most useful summary is given by Warren himself on p306, working from the Great Commandment (Matt 22:37-40) and the Great Commission (Matt 28:18-20)

By National Leader General Aung San 1915-1947

Aung San was a Burmese politician, independence activist and revolutionary. Aung San is the founder of the Myanmar Armed Forces, and is considered the Father of the Nation of modern-day Myanmar. He was instrumental in Burma's independence from British rule, but was assassinated just six months before his goal was realized.

Devoted to ending British rule in Burma, Aung San founded or was closely associated with many Burmese political groups and movements and explored various schools of political thought throughout his life. He was a life-long anti-imperialist and studied communism and socialism as a student, and Japanese Pan-Asianism upon joining the Japanese military. In his first year of university he was elected to the executive committee of the Rangoon University Students' Union and served as the editor of its newspaper. He joined the Thakin Society in 1938, working as its general secretary, and founded both the Communist Party of Burma and the Burma Socialist Party.

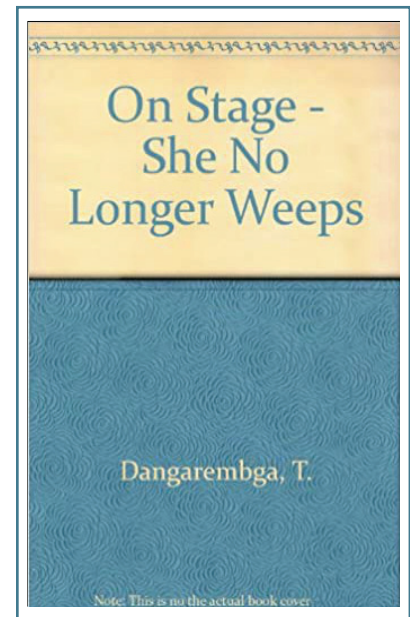

The Russian Invasion of Ukraine vis-a-vis International Law

Russia invaded Ukraine early on February 24, 2022, attacking many fronts with missiles, planes, and ground forces. The possibility of Ukraine and Georgia joining NATO had angered the Russian President, who wished to stop the alliance's eastward expansion and its encirclement of Russia. Since then, the international community has reacted to Ukraine's plea for assistance with military and humanitarian supplies as well as harsh sanctions on Russia but has refrained from deploying soldiers to the nation. The nation has also asked for assistance in front of international bodies including the International Criminal Court and the International Court of Justice. Russia's invasion of Ukraine is a violation of the prohibition on the use of force under Article 2(4) of the United Nations Charter. However, there are two exceptions to this prohibition; the use of force in self-defense under Article 51 of the Charter and collective security operations mandated by the Security Council. The use of force that does not fall within these exceptions is an act of aggression. However, as per Russia's recent submissions to the International Court of Justice, it has decided to defend its use of force as a form of collective self-defense under Article 51 of the UN Charter.

Tackling COVID-19 with AI

AI is a buzz word now for everything we do in our day-to-day life. In recent times mankind has seen the worst situation where everything which meant to be powerful had no control over lives. Nothing other than prevention and extension of natural immune system was shield for protection from Covid-19 virus. Masking face and nose was new normal for protection against this deadly virus. AI played a role as boon for working employees, it channelized way to protect people from traditional finger print punching to face or bio metric detection. Also, the idea that we come up with a system which could alert a person as soon as he removed mask, thus helping others and the individual to stay in-line with mask and hence protecting others from the deadly disease.

In past COVID-19 scenario when the deadly disease was huge spread, an effective face mask detection application using AI proved to be a saviour. This application helped in people to stay safe from spread of virus in the timeline when the number of instances of COVID-19 was being reported heavily around the country and was steadily rising due to opening of work spaces. The major purpose of this research was to put this AI based system in place at college entrances, airlines, hospitals, and offices where the risk of COVID-19 spreading through contagion is highest. According to reports, having a face mask while at work significantly minimizes the chance of transmission. For recognizing face masks, a hybrid model combining deep and traditional machine learning are used. This face mask detector is built with Python, OpenCV, TensorFlow, and Keras and is based on a dataset. Everyone should inspect their face before entering the building or the working area and make sure they have a mask with them which is wore and thus covers mouth and nose. A beep alert was triggered if somebody was found without a face mask. Thus, necessitating the

purpose of masking face. It can be brought to a close if everyone observes the safety precautions. As a result, we expect that this research will assist in detecting people wearing masks to work and thus help people to be safe during the spread of contagious diseases.

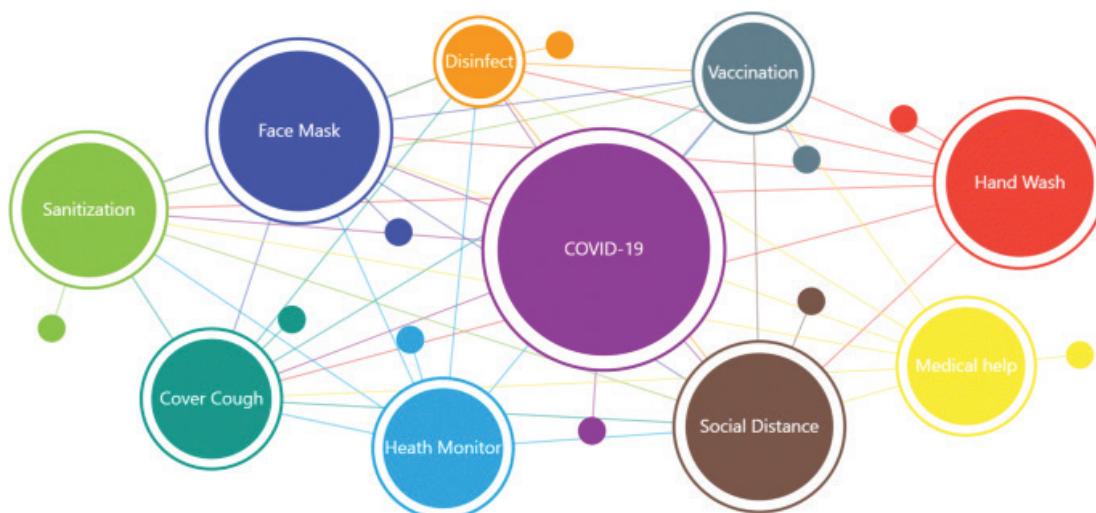
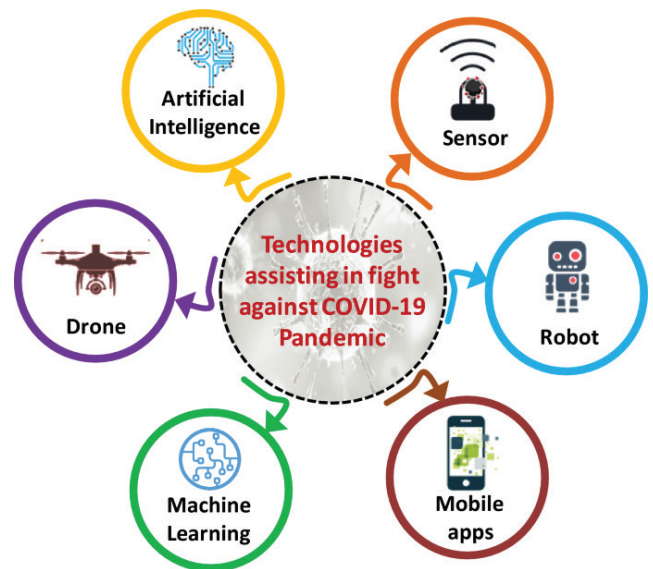
We as a group of researchers successfully made a system for face mask detection and checked its accuracy in all the environments one could work, so that the mandating of wearing mask is taken care of by machine itself without human intervention. This helps us to reduce manpower cost and casualties related to it, as the person has to be keen enough to check the surroundings and the employees involved. This proved to be an effective system to flatten the curve when the workspace is open and disease spread is on surge.

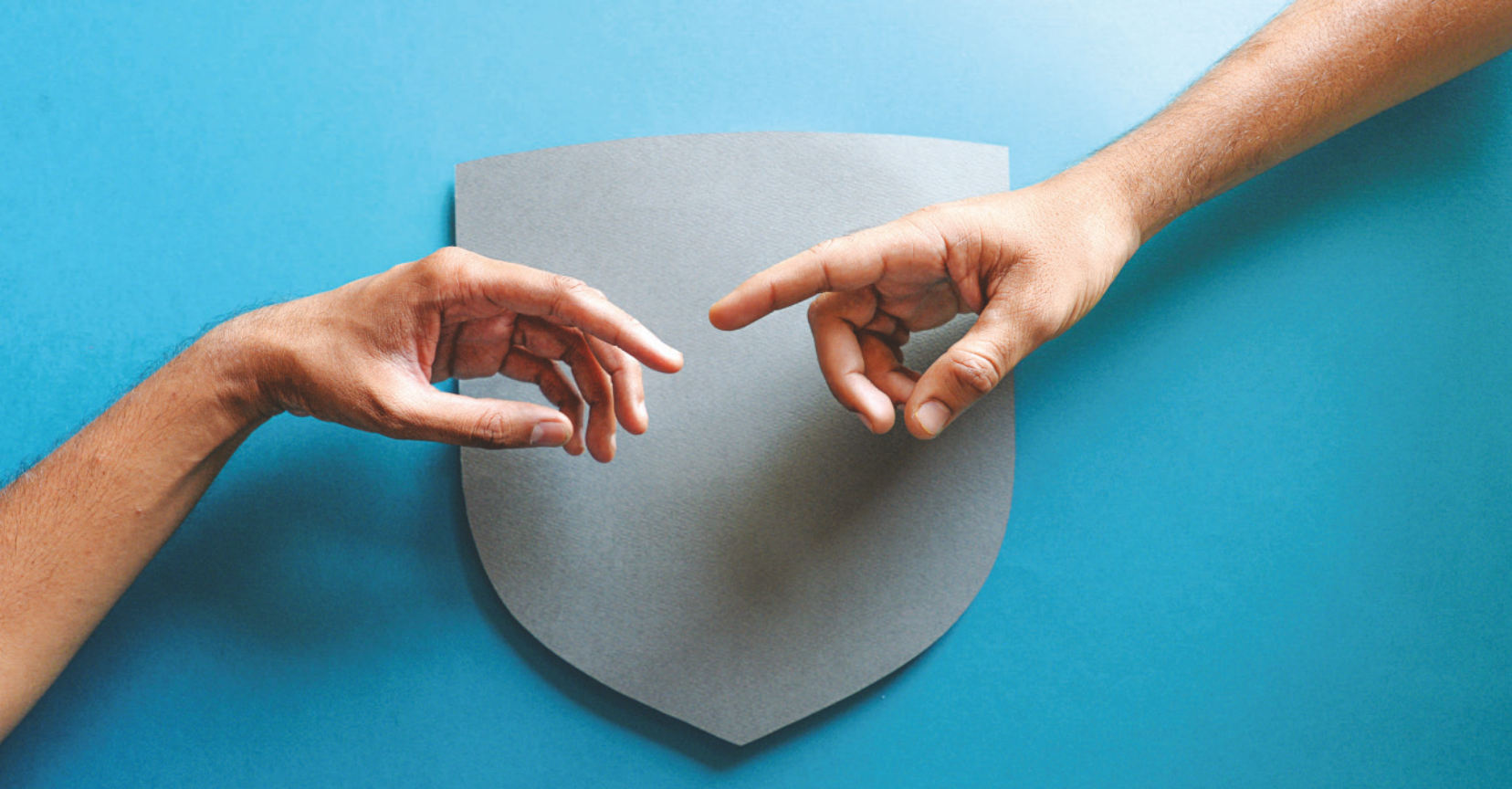

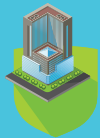
