Objective:

- 1 To encourage the development of skills in legal reasoning and analysis among the students.
- 2 To introduce students to basic theoretical perspectives on the creation and application of law.
- 3 To provide students with knowledge and appreciation of the major issues related to laws
- 4 To provide students with awareness of principles underpinning legal doctrine, and of the ways in which conflict of laws can be solved
- 5 To encourage students to make connections between their internships and what they have learned in the related core course
- 6 To discuss and provide feedback on draft content and draft presentation of the Internship assessed pieces of work at a stage early enough for a student to correct any perceived defects
- 7 To enable young lawyers to expose themselves to the real field of practice and observe the nuances ‘law in operation’
- 8 To promote students’ familiarity with Supreme Court procedures.
- 9 The purpose is to offer students the chance to acquire skills in drafting of legal documents, conducting legal research, and preparing for court processes.
- 10 To acquire knowledge and understanding of the ethical obligations and responsibilities that advocates have towards their clients and the legal system.
- 11 To Engage in self-reflection on internship experiences, solicit valuable input from supervising advocates, associates in Law firm or corporate house and pinpoint specific areas for personal and professional development in order to bolster future career opportunities in the legal domain

Course Outcomes: After completion of this course, student will be able to:

- 1 Get the opportunity to gain practical experience in legal research, writing, and analysis, allowing them to apply their theoretical legal knowledge to real-life situations.
- 2 Comprehend the significance of ethical issues in the legal field, which encompass preserving client confidentiality, preventing conflicts of interest, and adhering to professional conduct norms.
- 3 Improve analytical skills by recognising legal concerns, assessing pertinent case law and statutes, and constructing logical arguments to uphold legal positions
- 4 Develop connections with legal professionals, mentors, and peers to broaden professional networks and acquire valuable knowledge about future career trajectories in the legal domain.
