Objective:

- 1 To understand the meaning and scope of Legal Writing as a Discipline
- 2 To identify the importance of linguistics in legal writing

- 5 Identify and articulate legal issues in context.
- 6 Chose and implement an effective strategy, selecting and employing authoritative resources to locate relevant legal authority
- 7 To promote students' familiarity with High Court procedures.
- 8 The purpose is to offer students the chance to acquire skills in drafting of legal documents, conducting legal research, and preparing for court processes.
- 9 To acquire knowledge and understanding of the ethical obligations and responsibilities that advocates have towards their clients and the legal system.
- 10 To Engage in self-reflection on internship experiences, solicit valuable input from supervising attorneys, and pinpoint specific areas for personal and professional development in order to bolster future career opportunities in the legal domain.

Course Outcomes: After completion of this course, student will be able to:

- 1 Know the environment of the higher court
- 2 Understand the courtroom procedure of the higher court
- 3 Get the opportunity to gain practical experience in legal research, writing, and analysis, allowing them to apply their theoretical legal knowledge to real-life situations.
- 4 Comprehend the significance of ethical issues in the legal field, which encompass preserving client confidentiality, preventing conflicts of interest, and adhering to professional conduct norms.
- 5 Improve analytical skills by recognising legal concerns, assessing pertinent case law and statutes, and constructing logical arguments to uphold legal positions
- 6 Develop connections with legal professionals, mentors, and peers to broaden professional networks and acquire valuable knowledge about future career trajectories in the legal domain

Pre-requisite of course: Internship is a practical exposure of the students. In each session students need to go 4 weeks internship. Students need to submit weekly report and final consolidated reports.
